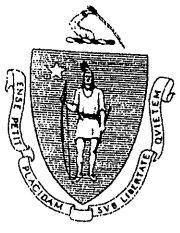


Dear Don:

DONALD PET, M.D. is a graduate of Johns Hopkins University and the University of Maryland School of Medicine. He took his internship at York General Hospital, Pennsylvania, and psychiatric residency at Phipps Clinic, Johns Hopkins Hospital. For two years, he was Acting Chief, Men's Addiction Service, N.I.M.H. Clinical Research Center, Lexington, where he was responsible for clinical and administrative supervision of the male addict in-patient service. Currently, he is Chief of Professional Service, in the Alcohol and Drug Dependence Division, Department of Mental Health, State of Connecticut.

DAVID E. SMITH, M.D. is the founder and Medical Director of the Haight Ashbury Medical Clinic, consultant on drug abuse at the San Francisco General Hospital, Assistant Clinical Professor of Pharmacology at the San Francisco Medical Center of the University of California, and lecturer in criminology at the University of California, Berkeley. 
